Scott Svab reported that the Finance Committee met prior to tonight’s meeting to discuss the 2017 budget. Finance Director William Rouse presented reports showing a decrease in the 1st quarter revenue. Some of the result is from House Bill 5. The net profit and returns are down. Depot on a program that will provide smoke and carbon monoxide detectors to veterans and disabled veterans. Chief Durkee stated they are still in the process of working on specs for the new truck.

Police Chief – A monthly report was included in the packet. Police Chief Doug Swartz stated that there is a directive to officers to be diligent with traffic stops. This helps to stop further criminal activity. Traffic stops are not a revenue producer. The department only sees about seven to ten dollars per ticket. Mr. Cozy asked if warnings go into databases. Chief Swartz stated yes.

Danny Losch thanked the department for the Canine signs that went up.

Engineer – Engineer Bill Dorman stated that they are assisting administration on the Natureworks Grant. Planning Commission will meet tonight and one topic will be Sandy Ridge development. Mr. Dorman said they are still wrapping up final items on the Cherry/Locust Intersection project. The bidding for the Locust Street Relief Sewer will take place on April 28th. Mr. Dorman said they are also assisting with the Chip and Seal bids. They are reviewing plans now and the advertisement will go out soon.

Mr. Dorman asked the Chief Swartz about data in regards to the Cherry/Locust Street intersection since it has been redone. Chief Swartz said he would have to pull the data.

Sean Craney asked if the timing could be looked at on left hand arrows as he has heard that they change very quickly.

Dear Mayor, Council Members and Trustees:

The firm of Bonezzi Switzer Polito & Hupp Co. L.P.A. (BSPH), and I specifically, have been asked by you to serve as a consultant which may include the occasional provision of my legal advice, with respect to the formation of a Joint Fire District between your two political subdivisions. BSPH and I have agreed to undertake this task subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this letter.

Although I will not be serving as your legal counsel per se, because my work includes the provision of general legal advice relating to fire services, I am providing this engagement letter as required or recommended in the jurisdictions in which BSPH practices law. Such letter is designed to address the various parties' responsibilities to each other. This engagement letter will outline our responsibilities to each other with respect to this matter.

The Standard Terms of Engagement respond to specific requirements in the rules of professional ethics. It addresses common issues that often arise in an attorney-client relationship. Please read this carefully, particularly the section on "Conflicts of Interest."

FEES AND EXPENSES

My rate of pay is \$180.00 per hour. The rate will not increase before January 1, 2017.

Depending on the circumstances, additional BSPH attorneys with particular areas of expertise/experience and/or other personnel may also perform work on this matter. Again, no rate will exceed that set forth above.

Time will be billed in one-tenth of an hour increments. All billing will be detailed, so the parties know exactly what work was performed and how much time the work took to complete. If there are specific expenses associated with this project (postage, long distance calls, mileage), the specific expense with documentary support where applicable will also be provided. Bills will be generated on a monthly basis. Payment for the bills should be remitted generally within thirty days of receipt.

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BSPH will provide monthly invoices for all services rendered in this project. The billing will be split equally between the two involved parties. By signing this agreement, each of the political subdivisions agrees to timely pay their portion of the invoice to BSPH. The billing will be sent to: City of Canal Fulton, 1165 Locust Street S, Canal Fulton, OH 44614, Attn: Raymond Durkee, Fire Chief, and Lawrence Township Trustees, 1165 Locust Street S, Canal Fulton, OH 44614, Attn: Mark Stewart, Fire Chief.

The political subdivisions involved in this project will not be required to pay a retainer fee, provided that the respective fiscal officers encumber funds and issue a purchase order in anticipation of work being performed.

COOPERATION

Each of the political subdivisions agrees to cooperate fully with BSPH in our work by, among other things, providing us with all requested information, and making yourself and any employees, agents or other persons or parties subject to your control or influence, reasonably available for consultation and interviews as needed. Furthermore, in order to enable us to render effective services in this matter, you have agreed to disclose fully and accurately all of the known facts and keep us informed of all future developments relating to this matter. We necessarily must rely on the accuracy and completeness of the facts and information provided to us.

CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

As stated previously, BSPH may, during the course of this project, provide general legal advice regarding the legal implications of various alternative choices relating to the creation of a joint fire district. Other legal advice pertaining to fire service related laws may also be provided. This advice will be provided to both political subdivisions with the understanding that both political subdivisions are interested in creating a joint fire district and that the legal advice is provided with that goal in mind.

However, when creating a joint fire district, which is essentially a joint venture or partnership between various political subdivisions, there is always a possibility that a conflict between the political subdivisions may exist. Where conflicts of interest may exist, BSPH will attempt whenever possible to refrain from taking a position that perpetuates the conflict of interest and instead will attempt to resolve it. However, BSPH and each of the political subdivisions agrees and acknowledges that each of the political subdivisions ultimately must rely upon their own legal counsel (County Prosecutor, Law Director, Solicitor, or other individual chosen by them to provide legal advice) in determining the legal implications of any joint resolution that may be created to form a joint fire district.

To the extent there is any conflict of interest on the part of BSPH or any of its attorneys individually in creating the joint fire district, the political subdivisions to this agreement expressly waive that conflict of interest and agree that BSPH and David C. Comstock, Jr. may provide legal advice relating to the creation of the joint fire district and fire and EMS service issues to each of the political subdivisions.

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ATTORNEY-CLIENT PRIVILEGE ISSUES

To the extent legal advice is being provided, the political subdivisions will be treated as one client, and legal advice will be provided to all political subdivisions at one time. Information will not be disseminated to outside parties by BSPH without the approval of the political subdivisions. However, the political subdivisions may choose, collectively or individually, to release information received by them from BSPH. However, to the extent the release of any information may serve as a waiver of any attorney-client privilege, the political subdivisions, individually and collectively, are urged to again consult with their legal counsel.

Notwithstanding the paragraph above, BSPH generally will conduct all business in a public forum and will urge the clients to communicate openly with members of the fire department and the public in order to avoid misconceptions or misunderstandings regarding the possible creation of a joint fire district.

TERMINATION OF ENGAGEMENT

Although we certainly expect to have a satisfactory and successful relationship, you agree that BSPH has the right to withdraw from this project if the terms and conditions of the engagement are not met. You agree that BSPH has the right to withdraw from this project if, among other things, there is a failure to cooperate or to follow advice on a material matter, or any upon any other matter or circumstance that would, in our view, render our continuing engagement unlawful or unethical.

If you fail to meet the obligations under this Agreement and continue to fail to do so thirty (30) or more days after we have attempted to provide written notice about the failure through correspondence sent to you, we shall have the right to the fullest extent authorized by any applicable rule or law, in our sole discretion and without any further authorization by you, to declare this engagement agreement at an end.

Likewise, any political subdivision may terminate their involvement in this project. The political subdivisions responsibility for fees generated pursuant to this agreement will terminate upon the receipt by BSPH and the other political subdivisions of notification regarding the withdrawal from the project. Any political subdivision remaining in the project agrees to the fee schedule set forth in this engagement letter.

PROJECTED FEES AND EXPENSES

Because of the uncertain nature of the project and the political subdivisions' willingness to participate or unknown thoughts regarding their involvement in this project, it is less predictable than most other business transactions in attempting to determine possible fees and expenses. At various times, it may be possible to give a general estimate as to the estimated cost of the project, and whenever possible, BSPH will attempt to provide an estimate based upon the known facts and positions of the political subdivisions at the time the request is made. At the outset, BSPH expects that the costs of this project will not

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

exceed, in the aggregate, \$15,000 (\$7,500 per political subdivision). It is likely that the costs will be significantly less, and ultimately as stated above the total costs are dependent upon the cooperation between and among the political subdivisions.

A Resolution Establishing the Fire Equipment Fund (Fund 393) to be used in accounting for the new property tax levy.

WHEREAS, the citizens of Canal Fulton approved Issue 17 on November 8 2016, which is a five-year 1.0 mill property tax levy for the purpose of purchasing capital fire equipment, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the City of Canal Fulton to establish a separate fund to account for the revenues and expenses associated with the tax levy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANAL FULTON, OHIO, THAT:

Section 1: Council hereby establishes Fund 393 as the Fire Equipment Fund to be used in accounting for the revenues and expenses associated with the new property tax levy.

Section 2: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

CONSTRUCTION AND PERFORMANCE AGREEMENT

The undersigned, Schalmo Properties, Inc., hereinafter called the "Developer", in compliance with Title One of the Planning and Zoning Code of the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio, entitled "Subdivision Regulations", hereby covenants and agrees to construct and install the proposed public pavement widening, storm sewer, and curb and gutter known as Locust Street Roadway Widening Improvements Phase 1B as previously approved by the City Council, hereinafter called the "Public Utility Project".

Developer further covenants and agrees:

1. That all such public improvements and utilities shall be constructed and installed in full compliance with the provisions of said Subdivision Regulations, as well as with specifications established by the City Engineer and kept on file in his office. The aforementioned provisions and specifications shall be considered part of this Agreement as though fully rewritten herein.
2. To notify the City Engineer when each phase of any and each improvement or installment is completed and ready for final inspection and approval thereof, and that any service rendered to the Developer by the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio, in connection with necessary inspections or other related matters shall be promptly paid by Developer, as they are billed therefore.
3. That such improvements will be completed and installed within eighteen (18) months of the date of this agreement.
4. That all such improvements and installations will be laid, constructed and installed in a workmanlike manner and that the Developer guarantees such work and materials for a period of two (2) years from the date of acceptance thereof by the City Engineer. Upon acceptance of improvements, the Developer shall file a maintenance bond which shall guarantee improvements for two years. The amount of the bond shall be determined by the City Engineer and approved by City Council.
5. That the Developer will bear and pay the total cost of all improvements thereof.
6. That the Developer will promptly replace or repair any work or materials shown to be defective within the two (2) year maintenance guarantee period, provided that timely notice of the nature of the same is given in writing to the Developer by the City Engineer. In the event that the Developer refuses or fails to replace any defective work or materials within a reasonable time after such notice thereof, the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio, may cause such work to be done and the Developer shall pay the cost of the same.
7. That a utility easement, utility right-of-way, and/or road right-of-way approved in form and content by the City Engineer shall be dedicated to the City over the public improvements constructed.
8. That a title report approved in form and content by the City Law Director, shall be furnished showing the titles to all lands to be dedicated as utility easement, utility right-of-way, and/or road right-of-way for the Project.

9. That all such required improvements shall be available to and for the benefit of the lands and lots fronting on said Public Utility Project.

The Developer further agrees to comply with the rules and regulations of the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio, governing the construction and installation of the above improvements, and to take the necessary safety precautions to prevent injury to persons and property on or about the site of the improvements. The Developer shall assume the defense of, indemnify, and save harmless the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio, and its individual officers and agents from all claims relating to labor and materials furnished for the work and from all liability for injuries to any person, corporation or property received or sustained by or from the act of the Developer or its employees, agents or subcontractors in connection with the construction and installation of the improvements herein set forth.

For the purposes of indemnifying and saving harmless the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio, from all claims for damages as set forth above, the Developer will give evidence by a certificate of insurance to the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio, of its having in effect a general liability insurance policy with \$500,000 coverage for each occurrence combined single limit of liability for bodily injury and/or property damage. Said certificate of insurance shall identify the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio, as additional insured.

In order to insure the full and faithful performance of the Agreement, the Developer attaches hereto, its unconditional escrow commitment or performance bond subject to the sole and exclusive control of the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio, in the sum of **Two Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$260,000.00)** to insure the construction of the Improvements shown on the approved plans and implementation of soil and erosion control measures. The Developer acknowledges that this sum shall be subject to the sole and exclusive control of the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio, for its release, based upon the City of Canal Fulton's acceptance for the performance assured herein. No direct or sub-contractual agreement of the Developer shall be deemed to authorize or encumber these funds, nor shall the obligation of the Developer constitute a basis for their release. Said funds shall be released only by the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio, upon proper acceptance of partial performance or completion, based upon the percentage of the project deemed completed and acceptable by the City Engineer, or the City Council, and no others. The Developer shall hold the City of Canal Fulton harmless, shall assure the defense of, and fully indemnify the City, its individual officers and agents from any and all liability for claims arising out of the release of escrow funds. Notwithstanding completion of the improvements mentioned herein, the escrow agreement shall not be released until a satisfactory maintenance bond in terms and amount approved by the City of Canal Fulton's Council; shall have been furnished for a maintenance period of two (2) years.
